Jackie Bliss, the most recent recipient of the Spirit of WEN award

Jackie Bliss, the most recent recipient of the Spirit of WEN award presented at the 2019 National Conference in March, has been described as a "champion of everyone she touches," and with that we take a deeper dive into the background of this inspiring founder and past-president of the WEN Boston chapter.

Jackie earned an MBA from the Leonard N. Stern School of Business at New York University and an MPA in Energy Policy as well as a BA from Columbia University. She then worked at National Grid, serving as the Director of Business Performance for the Natural Gas division, leading operational

efficiency initiatives. Jackie also consulted power and utilities companies across the U.S. on debt and equity financing and strategic M&A as an investment banker at J.P. Morgan.

In 2015, she joined Enel X (formerly EnerNOC) and managed their Advisory Solutions business, a 500-person team dedicated to providing differentiated consulting and services to help customers save money and achieve their energy-related goals. She also served as General Manager of their Global Energy Procurement business.

Jackie then transitioned into the role of Vice President and Head of Global Customers at Enel X, and is responsible for developing partnerships with the company's largest customers. In this role, she leads and manages a talented team responsible for originating new business opportunities and ensuring long term customer success.

Jackie's leadership drive continued outside of the office to form the WEN Boston chapter in 2017, with the goal of retaining talent in the energy sector in her region. Jackie devoted herself to building the foundation of the chapter, in great part to help other women who are significantly junior to her. Her Spirit of WEN award nomination distinguished her by explaining, "most people do not have the time or energy, while maintaining a high-powered position, to build something from the ground up to inspire others."

Yet this is exactly what Jackie did – and continues to do as a respected mentor to chapter leadership and members. Her impact has been described this way, "She has taken many of the other board members under her wing as a friend, a confidant, and an inspiration. We all aspire to be more like [her]."

While all the Spirit of WEN award nominees were highly deserving, Jackie's unique and significant contribution to the energy industry and the development of female leaders earned her this distinct and much-deserved award.

One of WEN Greater Oklahoma's most impactful programs is Mentoring Circles, which kicks off its fourth year this September and runs through May. Approximately 250 members participate, with 17 groups meeting in Oklahoma City and 10 groups meeting in Tulsa.

The program's objective is to create small mentoring groups that help mentees increase their knowledge, confidence, resourcefulness and support system to create opportunities for career advancement. Groups are

made up of mentees and mentors who do not work directly with or for each other, which helps to foster open, valuable discussions.

Groups meet once a month and discuss topics such as the art of negotiation, authenticity, building relationships beyond networking, conflict management, strategic agility, leadership and much more.

Maria Moore, a senior manager at Chesapeake Energy, is WEN OK's Mentoring Program Chair and has been instrumental in this program's success. Each month she creates and leads the research, including gathering resources, identifying the



topics to be covered and generating the facilitation guide for the mentoring material.

Maria's secret formula to the success of the Mentoring Circle Program is her passion for sharing her own experiences and insights to help women succeed in their career. Similar to the mentees, mentors also learn from participating in the program.

This program represents our commitment to helping women gain confidence and develop their ability to add significant value and advance in the energy industry.

"I am always surprised at how many women I meet who are waiting to be noticed, not asking for opportunities. I have two mentees who, with a little encouragement and coaching, asked for their next level of opportunity and aot it! It makes me wonder how much talent is hidden across the industry because people are afraid to ask. As a manager, I definitely will be intentional to look beyond the squeaky wheel."

2019 NATIONAL CONFERENCE RECAP

WEN's 2019 National Conference Was A Blast!

WEN's 2019 National Conference (March 27-29, 2019) was held for the first time in beautiful Colorado. It was a one-ofa-kind experience in terms of venue, content, attendees and unique networking opportunities to connect with other members across the energy industry. Over three days, almost 600 attendees were able to learn about hot topics, be inspired, and have fun in one of Colorado's newest and most scenic resorts—the Gaylord Rockies. The opening reception, sponsored by Anadarko Petroleum Corp. and Pierce Atwood, LLP, was held at the hotel on the evening of Wednesday, March 27. The reception featured a "glamping" theme ("Good Things Come to Those Who Glamp!") complete with fabulous indoor/outdoor camping decor, music, a photo bus, games, food, drinks, and decadent s'mores around the "glamp" fire.

The Conference began on Thursday morning with breakfast, coffee, and an amazing presentation, sponsored by Cimarex

Breakout Sessions 1 and 2 featured a range of relevant topics and enigmatic speakers centering around





four educational tracks — (1) Legal/Regulatory; (2) Technical; (3) Financial; and (4) Leadership. All were very well attended.

During Thursday's lunch, attendees came together again to hear the astounding story of persistence told by Dr. Christine Mann Darden (distinguished retired NASA scientist). Dr. Darden taught us that hard work, believing in yourself, and following your dreams can take you to the moon and beyond. Persistence really does matter. Many thanks to DCP Midstream for its sponsorship of Dr. Darden's presentation.

The afternoon Breakout Sessions were followed by a third general session, presented by WEN Colorado, that featuring

a fire-side chat between
Barbara Humpton (CEO of
Siemens USA) and Rachel
Miller (Partner, Forbes Tate

focused on women's
leadership, energy in the
future, and workforce
development. Barbara's
candid and effortless
storytelling made her
commentary very impactful
and memorable.

Following the final breakout session of the day was a fun "brew pub" themed reception sponsored by BakerHostetler in the Gaylord's Grand Lodge—then many attendees enjoyed dinner at various restaurants in downtown Denver.

The final day of the Conference began early in the morning with

an executive member networking event, followed by another general session featuring an outstanding presentation by Alice Jackson, President of Xcel Energy Colorado. Following breakfast, there were two more rounds of breakout sessions that included a variety of hot topics, from Big Data discussions to Legal & Financial Ethics in the Energy Industry, before heading into the closing ceremonies—which included presenting several awards to deserving recipients.


